

## TECHNICAL DATASHEET VERNA LEMON

VARIETY: Verna Lemon

### DESCRIPTION:

Spanish variety, of unknown origin. The Verna lemon tree usually presents two blooms a year, although sometimes it is extended to three, which are in spring and summer, being possible in autumn as well, but by forced flowering. The tree is large and has fewer thorns than the fine lemon tree. The third harvest Verna lemon is called red lemon.

### FRUIT CHARACTERISTICS:

The size of the fruits is variable.

Weight (g): 130 gr. approximately.

Diameter (mm): 65-70 mm

Shape: Oval fruit, with a good-sized mamelon, and prominent at the base of the fruit; fine or rough skin, yellow when the fruit is ripe, provided with abundant oil glands.

Bark (mm): 6-7 mm

Color: Intense Yellow,

% Juice: 30-35%

Seeds: 3 - 4

Fruiting: Very high.

Collection: In the second season from February to June. A summer harvest called Rodrejo Lemon can be produced.

The "ruddy" fruits have thinner and less thick skin than those of the spring flowering
